

I can't thank our customers enough for their understanding of our main building remaining locked down to the public until further notice!

Here are some additional statistics accomplished in July...

The flight school tricycle gear A/C flew 113 hours and the tail wheel A/C flew 35 hours. Stanton Sport gliders flew 11 hours and the SYN tow plane flew 17.9 hours in support of both Stanton Sport gliders as well as additional relief for the soaring club during busy launch windows.

For the first time in my time here, we now have active glider students working in the S2-32 with Brad and the S1-26 (right) is on-line and available for rent. Give us a call for rental details of both ships.
