


Grass Roots Flyer February 2020



Friends of Stanton Airfield,

The Board of Directors of Historic Stanton Airfield is excited to bring you up to date on the many positive changes that have occurred in the past 3 years. The maintenance shop has been extremely busy with routine aircraft maintenance and several restoration projects. This increased activity required the hiring of additional staff. Flight school activity has increased, especially this last year. We currently have 3 part-time instructors, with 2 of them also working in the shop as part-time mechanics when time allows. The Board approved the construction of another hangar, which filled up immediately, to address the long list of airplanes waiting for storage space. We continue to have a waiting list of both airplanes and gliders. Many improvements to the existing building have been made including replacing rotting windows, doors, fixing a leaking tower roof, adding a cement patio, and regrading multiple sites to improve our site drainage. A new administrative position has been added to help with all inventory levels, purchasing, work orders, invoicing and associated QuickBooks processes. These changes have resulted in tighter controls and accountability.

All of these changes have resulted in increased productivity and revenue, but also have increased expenses. Even with all that has been done, there are still important projects left to complete such as the main building roof, electrical/plumbing upgrades, equipment upgrades and new shop windows.

The Board relies on the Friends of Historic Carleton Airport, volunteers and individual users to help maintain, improve and market the airport, but this takes funds that the airport does not have. You are receiving this letter because you are a user and a supporter of Stanton Airfield. The Board is inviting you to become more involved in the support of the airport by buying shares in Stanton Sport Aviation, Inc. The minimum purchase is 2 shares. A share sells for \$1,000 and entitles you to a voice at the annual meeting and input on the election of Board of Directors. The funds generated by the sale of these shares will be used to increase Stanton Sport aviation's asset base.

I hope you will consider purchasing 2 or more shares as an initial investment or as an addition to your current shares to continue your support of Stanton Airfield. Share purchases require Board approval. Your intention may be addressed to
