



Letter from the Stanton Sport Aviation, Inc. President:

Stanton Sport Aviation was organized in 1990 when a group of aviation enthusiasts purchased the airfield to preserve Stanton Airfield for sport aviation activities. The airport is privately owned by shareholders and open to the public. The runways, surrounding cropland, main building and hangars are assets of the corporation and income is produced from rentals, flight instruction, maintenance and hangar rental. With no government subsidies, the financial challenges have been difficult. (Indeed, the corporation pays taxes which municipal airports do not.) Many generous supporters have volunteered countless hours and made substantial donations for the benefit of Stanton Airfield. Thank you to all of you who have supported Stanton throughout the past 30 years.

My goal is to emphasize the current challenges and to solicit any suggestions that might aid in this particularly difficult time. We currently have a cash flow problem and are working diligently to find good solutions. Adding debt is not a good option in that the corporation is carrying significant debt already. The Board prefers to work through this shortfall without borrowing. Please contact me, any Board members or the airport manager, John Quilling, with any helpful thoughts. I know there are many talented folks who treasure this airfield who may have thoughtful and constructive ideas. We are very grateful for your support.

Ticket to Ride:

Refurbishment Project of S2-33K:

National Headquarters of Civil Air Patrol contracted with Stanton Sport Aviation to refurbish this glider. This shop project started back in late spring and as you can

see the recovering of the fuselage has been completed. We'll report more later as the wings are added and the first flight occurs.





Airport Manager Report:

With the fall season over-shadowing us now, I'd like to expand just a bit on the President's comments you saw on page 1 regarding our current cash flow situation. As all of us are living this COVID 19 pandemic, our own day-to-day activities were affected due to the shelter-in-place a few months back. Very few of us are back to the normal we knew.

Here at SYN, we only pumped 54 gallons of gas in March, 868 gallons in April and we eased back into flight OPS in May. We've had to try making up for lost fuel & flying revenue in the last three months and are hoping for a strong fall season. The shop has been steady, but with less manpower. The shop carries the current major burden of the entire operation, and has work booked right through the end of year.

A lot of small businesses have closed their doors both short term and for good. A few large FBOs prosper, while many are carving a path simply to stay alive. Please consider your support in getting us through these uncharted times of this pandemic. We have multiple ways for you to contribute, just give us a call. The entire staff here at Stanton stays committed to the general aviation community, providing a grass roots product and service that will be around for generations to come.
